1. Discussion of the workshop and how to proceed

This point of the agenda is discussed together with the conveners H. Bernas, H. Blattmann, R. Bock, D. Habs, A. Haque (for G. Moschini), P. Mando, E. Nolte, E. Otten, J. Soares and I. Takahashi (for M. Arnould). The report should finally have a similar form as the NuPECC report of November 1991, so the present contribution have to be revised and reduced in size. They should finally be very general with a few highlights and a few main references.

The NuPECC liaison members and the conveners are asked to form editing groups and prepare a condensed version until April 15, emphasizing future perspectives.

These reports will then be looked at and discussed at the next NuPECC meeting.

2. Minutes of the last meeting

The minutes of the eighteenth meeting are agreed upon without changes.

3. Report of the chairman

P. Kienle welcomes J. Äystö as the new NuPECC member for Finland.

Since the last meeting, the following letters have been written and received:

- letter of termination to Gordon & Breach together with R. Ricci
- letter to Claude Détraz according to point 10 of the minutes of last meeting
- letter from Aymar/Détraz concerning Ganil Plus
- answer to that letter
- letter from Gordon & Breach concerning termination of contract
- letter to P. Fricker re: budget 1994/1995 according to point 3 of the minutes of last meeting

Copies of all these letter have been sent to all members.

In addition, P. Kienle has received a letter from R. Ricci as chairman of the Nuclear Physics Board of the EPS, stating that R. Bock has again been appointed as observer to NuPECC and asking NuPECC to do likewise.

P. Kienle proposes G. Morrison as observer to NPB/EPS and is asked to find out, whether G. Morrison accepts.

Another letter has been received from H. Schopper asking P. Kienle as chairman of NuPECC and Nuclear Physics Division of EPS at a meeting about "Large Facilities" at the University of Lausanne on September 12 to 14, 1994.

P. Kienle is asked by the committee to give this talk on the basis of the NuPECC Report from November 1991 and its consequences and reporting on the present activities

Copies of both letters are included.

4. ELFE

P. Kienle reports on his contacts with various nuclear and particle physicists, especially concerning the common activities in the TESLA project at HERA, where many of the physicists interested in ELFE are already involved.

Following the NuPECC recommendations, P. de Witt Huberts is asked to organize a presentation of the physics case featuring two talks of ~ 45 minutes each at the next NuPECC meeting which will then be thoroughly discussed.

5. Nuclear Physics News

The contract with Gordon & Breach has been terminated due to the planned expansion of NPN to the US which was hindered by difficulties between Gordon & Breach and the APS.

Now the APS still causes problems, and Gordon & Breach has made a new offer, including a step back to \$5000 per issue, 2000 additional copies to be distributed where we want, and the expansion to Japan and China with them.

P. Kienle is now asked to contact DOE and NSF to find out, whether there is a possibility to proceed bypassing the APS.

So depending on the outcome, there are the following options:

- we proceed as planned with Gordon & Breach
- we proceed as planned, but not with Gordon & Breach
- we do not proceed towards the US and stay with Gordon & Breach

A final decision will be taken at the next NuPECC meeting.

6. Miscellaneous

- H. Karow reports on a letter he has received from Papanicolas asking for a Greek member to NuPECC without paying the member fee and being reimbursed for travel expenses by NuPECC. NuPECC appreciates the interest and offers its help in negotiations with the Greek authorities about a possible observer status at a reduced fee for a limited time. H. Karow will answer the letter of Papanicolas in this sense.

- A. Fonseca proposes a discussion on the situation of nuclear physics in "smaller" countries at the next NuPECC meeting. This point is taken up and will be put on the agenda.
- The next meeting will take place on April 23/24, 1994, in Vienna.
